Shelby Park and Bottoms HISTORIC URBAN PARK AND NATURAL AREA

Shelby Park and Bottoms encompass nearly 1300 acres of bluffs, rolling hills, and floodplain bordering the Cumberland River in East Nashville. Shelby Park and Bottoms is home to a community center, the nature center, nearly 10 miles of paved trails, more than 7 miles of unpaved hiking trails, sports fields, picnic shelters, and so much more!

Shelby Park was originally a private amusement park designed to attract residents to the growing Nashville suburbs. On July 4th, 1912 Shelby was dedicated as a city park and opened to the public. The Shelby Golf Course was opened in 1924.

Shelby Botoms Natural Area, added to the park system in 1994, is over 900 acres of locally protected wetlands and floodplane. Users can explore flora and fauna in this unique ecosystem. At the north end of the Shelby Bottom is the former Cornelia Fort Airpark with greenway access and other park amenities.


